From Pastor Karleen...

Growing Young, Part 4

Take Jesus' Message Serious: What's Young About the Good News

I don't know about you, but I made a lot of mistakes when I was younger. That included getting pregnant in my early 20's before getting married at a time when that was not at all what someone who was "Christian" did. As you can imagine, I felt a lot of shame around that. My partner, who would later become my husband, was very supportive of me. Yet, it was hard for me to even talk about it with anyone, much less with anyone at church. I eventually lost the baby when I was about 5 months pregnant. When that happened, I was completely blown away by how my church family supported and surrounded us with grace and love. It changed me and my attitude toward this community of faith, helping me to understand what it really means to take Jesus' message seriously. And, especially, to understand that this message is not one of shame, but of redemption. It's not a narrative of being cast out based on sin, but one of being embraced and restored.

That congregation - a Wisconsin Synod Lutheran congregation, mind you - was following Jesus' message, the good news that is about freedom, not condemnation. And the restoration of one who felt broken to restoration.

The teenagers and emerging adults we know face a long list of obstacles that threaten to get in the way of their search for Jesus. That includes our culture and their extended adolescent journeys. It also includes churches that are "drained by a thin gospel." What's a "thin gospel?" It's a gospel that isn't just preached, but lived throughout a community of faith..

As the authors of *Growing Young* did their research, they found that those congregations who were committed to taking Jesus' message of grace and redemption seriously, demonstrated it in action and through an overall spirit that pervaded the faith community.

Now, maybe you've heard less-than-inspiring news about the faith of today's young people. Recent research by the National Study of Youth and Religion identified that the dominant religious belief system of teenagers today was that of *moralistic therapeutic deism*. This belief system is *moralistic*, meaning the religious young people equate faith with being a good, moral person (being *nice*). It's about *therapeutic* because faith is a way of feeling better about themselves. And it's *deistic*, meaning that God exists, but this God is not one that is active in our today with much regularity. Thanks to moralistic therapeutic deism (MTD), God has essentially become a heavenly butler for teenagers, inspiring them at best to become cordial to others.

So, how do we share the Gospel in a way that allows faith in young people that comes from being open and questioning, not from a moralistic perspective. Churches who take Jesus' message seriously pay attention to the life and words of Christ. This results in young people who can articulate a gospel that is less talk about beliefs and more talk about Jesus, less tied to formulas and more focused on redemptive narrative, and less about heaven later and more about life here and how.

Young people want to know not only what they are saved *from* but also what they are saved *for*. They want to take action, not just hear about what they can't do. *Participation* and *challenge* are two central features of churches growing young.

Young people want to share their faith today in a way that looks different from the past. This includes authentic relationships, listening well, and being honest about questions and doubts.

The conversations we have during worship are intended to lean into this, building intentional cross-generational relationships that feel true, inviting one another to talk and also to *listen* well, and to be open to asking questions. It means wondering together about what a story from scripture might be saying, not simply jumping to the moralistic summary of our own youths.

Honestly, it feels fresher and freer and much more like the way in which Jesus did his own ministry.

So, notice next time you hear a scripture story and what words and phrases are being used to talk about Jesus, the gospel, and sharing our faith. And, if you're with a young person, notice, in particular, how they respond to a message that *isn't* moralistic, but that seeks to lean into relationships and truly living as the connected body of Christ. They will notice. And thank you for it.

The General Fund giving continues to be a significant concern. For the first two months, the total given to the General Fund was \$31,307.09, coming in a little over \$10k short of the needed budget amount of \$41,371. Building Fund giving was \$16,213 versus a budget of \$11,410. If you are able, please consider increasing your monthly donation to the general fund. Holy Week and Easter - This Year @ Rejoice

As we approach Easter, we invite you to observe Holy Week, a sacred time to linger in the space between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. This week challenges the divisions that separate humanity, such as powerful and powerless, enemy and friend, innocent and guilty. Holy Week provides an opportunity to confront our pain and the pain of others.

Our Holy Week Liturgy, which will be identical for both services on Maundy Thursday at 6:30p and Good Friday at 2p, offers a creative way to engage in this sacred time through communion, prayer, meditative Taizé songs, and expressions of grief.

We will also observe the **Stations of the**



Cross, an ancient meditative pilgrimage on Jesus' "Way of Sorrows" to his death. We will use a graphic art series by Lauren Wright Pittman that offers a modern reflection on Jesus' journey to crucifixion. A companion guide will be available for you as you follow Jesus' journey on Maundy Thursday, from 1-6p and Good Friday, from 11a-1:30p.

We know that Easter Sunday is meant to be a jubilant celebration, a chance to begin again. Yet, for many, grief can weigh heavily on their hearts.

We hope you will join us this Holy Week and Easter at Rejoice!






April's Noisy Offering




Community Food Rescue: Vegetables, produce, bakery items that have been donated by various individuals and community businesses are available to you at no charge.
